


TRAVELLING WITH MATTHEW IN 2014

2014 is the year of Matthew.



Unexpected New Life – Matthew J. Marohl (BS2575.53 MAR UN)

This is a short, simple examination of the Gospel of Matthew. Short, readable chapters encourage the reader to rethink the story and provide excellent material for discussion in Bible study groups.






A Simple Guide to Matthew – Paul J. McCarren (BS2575.53 MCC SM)

This book provides a new translation of the Gospel, leading readers chapter by chapter through the text. Each section includes the scripture reading and a brief, engaging commentary about how readers can relate to the material. The *Simple Guides* introduce readers to life in early Christianity, describe points of controversy, and show how each section fits with those that went before.

Simple Guides are also available for the Gospels of Mark, Luke and John.

Matthew (Navigating the Gospels) – Philip Fogarty (BS2575.53 FOG MN)

This series offers insights into the Gospels for the general reader. The reader is invited to take an imaginative journey, looking at the people, places and actions of the various actors in the Gospel stories, identifying with them in the hope of better understanding the Gospel's message.



Navigating the Gospels are also available for the other Gospels.




Exploring Matthew's Gospel: A Guide to the Gospel Readings in the Revised Common Lectionary – Leslie J. Francis & Peter Atkins (BS2575.53 FRA EM)


This series explores the Gospel readings from the lectionary in a manner suitable for different personality types. Each weekly reading is looked at in four different ways – sensing, intuition, feeling, thinking. This is a helpful method of studying the Gospel in a way that allows readers to view the message from a variety of different perspectives.

Exploring Mark's Gospel and Exploring Luke's Gospel are also available.

The Way Opened Up by Jesus: A Commentary on the Gospel of Matthew – José A. Pagola (BS2575.53 PAG WO)

This book travels through the Gospel starting at the beginning and travelling through highlighting key passages and providing five meditations on each passage. Ideal for a daily Bible study.






Following in the Footsteps of Jesus: Meditations on the Gospels for Year A – José A. Pagola (BS2575.54 PAG FF)

This book offers a guide for reading the weekly Gospel readings and provides a brief homily for meditation every week for the Liturgical Cycle A. This is a great resource for personal meditation on the lectionary Gospel reading either in preparation for Sunday or as a follow up reflection.

Matthew for Everyone (2 volumes) – Tom Wright (BS2575.3 WRI ME)

This two volume commentary is a great way to develop a more in depth understanding of the Gospel. Written "for everyone", it explores the Gospel in an approachable style.

This series also covers the rest of the New Testament and a series covering the Old Testament is also available.





Matthew - Thomas G. Long (BS2575.3 LON MA)

This provides a more in depth look at the Gospel of Matthew. Starting at Matthew 1 it works through the entire Gospel explaining the book in its original historical context and exploring its significance for faithful living today. An ideal resource for individual or group study.
